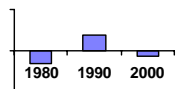

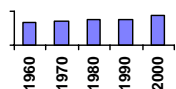
NET MIGRATION: DECADE ENDING...

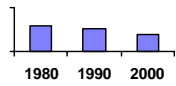

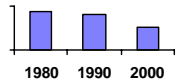
